

# Advocating for a 5% rate increase for Home & Community-Based Services in 2015 and 2016

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## The Need

- A 5% rate increase for Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) in 2014 helped address a crisis in Minnesota.
- Looking ahead, funding to support people with disabilities and older adults must continue to be prioritized.
- Even with the recent increase, rates for HCBS are far behind the pace of inflation. Between SFY 2006 and 2015, provider rates that pay for caregiver wages increased only 10.4% while inflation rose 23.3 %.
- Past budget cuts, freezes, and economic stagnation have produced significant challenges. These reductions have resulted in high turnover and difficulty retaining consistent, trusted staff - crucial to quality of care.

## Specifics of the proposal

- Bill language includes a 5% rate increase for HCBS and Intermediate Care Facilities for Developmental Disabilities (ICF/DD), effective 2015 and 2016.
- 75% of the new revenue must be used to increase compensation-related costs for employees, and not persons employed in the central office, owners, or persons paid under a management contract.
- Senate SF 646, chief author Sen. Eken, and clone SF 647. House HF 564, chief author Rep. Hamilton.

## The Benefits

#### Improves the Quality of Life for more than 90,000 Individuals and their Families

- This critical funding will ensure that high quality services for people with disabilities and older adults across the state of Minnesota are available, stable, and sustainable.
- Quality services allow people with disabilities and older adults to live as independently as possible in the community, develop strong job skills, gain professional experience, and find employment opportunities.
- The growing number of individuals with disabilities and older adults in Minnesota is fueling a growing demand for quality care in the community.

### Values Quality Direct Support Professionals (DSPs) and Caregivers

An increase will provide opportunities to boost wages and benefits for these essential care workers and ensure a more stable, quality work force for older adults and people with disabilities.

#### Strengthens Minnesota's Economy and State Budget

- Wage and benefit increases support local economies as DSPs and caregivers remain in their communities, hold jobs, purchase goods and pay taxes.
- An increase will promote stability for service providers, and allow them to continue offering quality care. It will decrease staff turnover that requires significant financial investments in recruitment and training.
