Close the Gap Spotlight: Dave Tueffel



Every newsletter, we highlight an individual who is helping us close the gap. This issue, we would like to highlight Dave Tueffel, a parent of an individual at Ludden House.

How one family member equipped Phoenix home with assistive technology

"Alexa, turn on my bedroom lights." And just like that the lights in Valerie Tueffel's room turn on within a brief moment. Five years ago, Program Manager Shawna Zechmeister never would have imagined all the tools Ludden House would be equipped with to make life easier for the individuals who live there.

But now, nearly half a dozen devices are set up throughout the house to help Val and

her roommates live a more independent lifestyle – all thanks to Dave Tueffel, Val's dad.

Close the Gap Spotlight: Dave Tueffel

When Val moved into Ludden House in 2017, Dave brought in the technology she used, Amazon Echo, and set them up for her. "At the time, Phoenix was new to it; now everyone knows about it," said Dave. Since then, Dave has installed Amazon Alexa, Echo Dot, Echo Show, and Smart Plug. With these devices, she's able to turn on her lights and TV, control her fan, and video chat with her parents, among other tasks.

Building a Smart Home

"This has freed up a lot of staff time and gives Val more independence," said Dave. "She's a lot like her older sisters. She's very independent and likes to do things on her own. Before, she felt bad for having to ask the staff for help when they were busy; now, she can do it on her own."

Ever since Val moved in, Dave continues to be a resource for the entire Phoenix family. "He's a fantastic support for Val," said Alan Berner, Vice President of Community Services. "That involvement has been huge for Val, but it has also trickled down to help for her roommates as well."

Now, other Phoenix homes have introduced technology into their day-to-day living as well. For example, the individuals at Howard House use an Amazon Cube to control the TV with their voice and those at Afton House use Amazon Echo Dot to play music and call for staff in the other room.

Back at Ludden House, Dave helps out whenever he can. "I've told them to contact me if they need something fixed," said Dave. "I work with my hands for a living, so it comes naturally to me."
