

## Message from the President

#### Phoenix Celebrates 40 Years

Dedicated to the Ludden Family in Memory of Margaret Ludden

n honor of our 40th Anniversary, we held an open house on October 15, 2017 at Jimmy's Event Center in Vadnais Heights, to celebrate this important milestone in our organization's history. In the words of Margaret Ludden, our founder, "There is no way to share the history of The Phoenix Residence, Inc. without referring to the entire family of Robert and Margaret Ludden, and especially John, our oldest son who was diagnosed as an individual with cerebral palsy/spastic condition incurred at birth." Ultimately, the Luddens had ten children, all of whom had some involvement or connection to the Phoenix project.

Forty years ago on October 5, 1977, John Ludden was the first resident to move into a barrier-free architectural residential facility for persons with developmental and physical disabilities (located at 135 Colorado St. E in St. Paul, Minnesota). The building boasted a state-of-the-art design with a common entrance and private bedrooms for 48 individuals. According to Margaret, prior to the Phoenix project plan, there were no known supervised living programs in the United States, and specifically not in Minnesota. A mere ten years later, The Phoenix Residence had provided services to over 100 people and expanded to two locations, an apartment at Wheelock Ridge Villa and a home at 435 Clinton Ave. in St. Paul.

hen The Phoenix Residence celebrated its 20th Anniversary in 1997, Margaret and John Ludden were there to celebrate with us. Little did we know, this would be the last anniversary celebration they would attend. John enjoyed his life at English House until his death in 2004, passing away within six months of Margaret's death. Margaret indicated in an article published by the *St. Paul Voice* in 1997, "She is confident that her dream is in very capable hands, and she could not say enough about the wonderful dedicated staff at The Phoenix Residence, Inc."

By 2007, Phoenix had transformed from its flagship facility to six-bedroom homes in communities near individuals' families, friends and workplaces. It is amazing to reflect



on the shifting of society views over the last 40 years. At one point, it was believed that people with disabilities could not be served in the community and that there was no benefit in attempting to connect these people with their families. Now, we recognize our citizens with disabilities as valuable members of our community, along with our desire to integrate them fully into the community—by opening doors, not closing them.

The Phoenix Residence would like to thank everyone who has contributed to making this organization great! We have served over 500 people, expanded to the seven-county metro area, and are now serving people across a spectrum of needs, from around-the-clock care in group homes to

services in one's own home. Phoenix employs 260 individuals, and we will continue in our journey of expanding our person-centered services. The celebration at Jimmy's was well attended. We took the opportunity to recognize and honor some individuals and families for their ongoing support of our organization. Please see the honorees listed on the previous page.

## Looking Towards the Future

hen the Ludden family opened the doors to the original Phoenix Residence, it was hard to imagine where the future of disability services was headed. Fortunately today, the field is a cornucopia of services throughout the state—

thanks to the hard work and perseverance of the Luddens and many others families like them.

However, where we are today is nowhere near the end of the journey—instead, it is only the beginning. Individuals have left institutions and now live and work in their community. But, the next chapter in their lives is to help them build their own communities where they want them according to their vision.



With the mandate of an ambitious Olmstead Plan,

Minnesotans with disabilities will realize the full empowerment of citizenship with all the rights and responsibilities that it entails. And the next generation of Phoenix will walk beside them on this journey. With a focus on employment, housing, education, and community engagement, The Phoenix Residence is continually promoting a better quality of life for individuals with disabilities.

Our sister corporation, Phoenix Service Corporation (PSC), is also looking towards the future by working to end homelessness. PSC partners with Washington and Ramsey counties to provide housing support to individuals experiencing homelessness. Finding affordable housing continues to be our biggest challenge,

but we will continue to seek out opportunities to help these individuals find and maintain stable housing.

Bill Schroeder, moved to The Phoenix Residence in 1978 Another step in our journey of supporting individuals with disabilities is to build our expertise and services in the autism field, one of the fastest growing developmental disabilities in the United States, effecting one in 68 children. Phoenix staff are participating in training opportunities and connecting with community groups and agencies supporting individuals with autism. These opportunities will help us continue building our expertise in the coming years.

As it was 40 years ago, much of what the future holds for the next half a century has yet to be envisioned. But what we do know is that it will take the same hard work, vision, and advocacy that our founders embodied to arrive at where we are today. This is by no means an easy task, but we will forever be driven, because we know we have a moral imperative to do so. We have seen how these efforts have impacted those we have served.

Don't we all want the same?


Although Margaret is no longer with us, her dreams live on here at The Phoenix Residence, as we continue to grow and provide exceptional service to those just like her son.






