Over 1,000 passionate advocates from across the state united to rally for the support of disability services.

The rally was electrified by speeches from several legislators, including our very own Representative Brion Curran, who represents our Caswell, Centerville, and English homes. Their presence underscored the importance of our cause.

After the rally, we shared heartfelt stories and compelling testimonials with our legislators, emphasizing why organizations like ours cannot endure further cuts. We successfully met with 13 of our 18 legislators in the Minnesota House and Senate, making a strong case for the vital services we provide.
